The Program for Mexican Communities Abroad was created by the Government of the Republic in February of 1990 as a strategy of its foreign policy. Its mission is to improve and grow connections with Mexicans and populations of Mexican origin that live abroad through the promotion of projects that are common interest and benefit.

The Program acts through the diplomatic and consular representations of Mexico, and in the case of the USA, also through the Mexican Centers and Institutes that the Program itself promotes.

The Program's objectives are:

- To promote and facilitate the realization of joint projects, as well as to serve as liaison between Mexican and Mexican-origin communities in the USA with national [i.e., Mexican] private and public individuals and institutions.
- To cultivate a better image of Mexico abroad and of Mexican-Americans in our country by publicizing their struggles and de sus luchas y achievements, and to promote [a better] knowledge of our fellow nationals, and the respect and dignified treatment that they deserve.

The areas of effort of the Program are: education, culture, health, sports, business and community organization.

Immediate Measures
(not an official translation)

To ensure that Mexicans who live in the USA have opportune information and orientation from the Government of the Republic, and to avoid that they be victims of abuses and frauds, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (Secretaría de Relaciones Exteriores, SRE) will implement eleven measures through its Embassy and the 50 consulates in the USA:

1. Publicize amongst the Mexican Community the Center for Information and Attention to Mexicans (Centro de Información de Atención a Mexicanos, CIAM). This toll free number, available from the USA (**1 855 463 6395**) offers a first point of contact with the Government of Mexico for whomever requires consular assistance, information or protection.
2. Implement a direct 1-800 line available 24 hours, to respond to questions about immigration measures and report incidents.
3. Promote amongst the Mexican community the use of the free mobile device app *MiConsulmex*, which has relevant information about immigration issues, as well as contact information for the [Mexican] consulates [anywhere in the world] as well as providers of immigration y providers of immigration services.
4. Increase the presence of mobile consulates in order to offer full services of consular protection and documentation to a greater number of persons in their communities.
5. To ensure that all Mexicans have ID's, the number of appointments to obtain consular matriculation, passports and birth certificates will be increased.
6. Redouble efforts to have children of Mexican nationals born in the US be registered and have issued birth certificates.
7. Extend the hours of the Departments of Protection of the consulates so that they can see a greater number of cases.
8. Accelerate the opening of Financial Orientation Desks and strengthen the campaign to promote the use of banks in all the consular network. *This is a particularly ambiguous sentence in the original Spanish. The translation may be wrong. I will try to verify the meaning.*
9. Reinforce the dialog with state and local authorities, in the understanding that local policies determine, in good measure, the daily life of Mexicans in the US.
